Imagining the Pacific in Scotland in the late 18th and early 19th centuries...

Guidance for completing UEA's online application form (supplementary to that provided in the published specifications).

- (1) Indicate in section 1 that the application is for the AHRC/National Museums Scotland Collaborative Doctoral Partnership at the Sainsbury Research Unit.
- (2) In the project proposal section, cut and paste the 'Project Description' section of the further particulars, without the images.
- (3) In the 500-word personal statement section, put there the statement requested in the further particulars, 'outlining your reasons for your interest in the project, and initial thoughts on how you would approach it'.
- (4) Provide a separate 2-page CV, in addition to the CV information requested within the application form.
- (5) Provide an example of recent academic writing (2016-2020), for example an MA essay or dissertation chapter, or an undergraduate dissertation where the applicant does not have an MA.

With respect to the location of the studentship, it is anticipated that the student will spend blocks of time in Norwich and Edinburgh, starting with the first semester (Oct-Dec 2020) at UEA, with intermittent travel between the two places as necessary. A period of research in the Pacific region is also planned.
